Make a little room in your yard for a Brown-headed Nuthatch

The Brown-headed Nuthatch, a southern bird born and bred, needs your help to find a good home. They're losing their pristine pine homes due to urbanization and deforestation. These darlin', squeaky birds need more nest boxes today so we can enjoy them for generations to come.

NEST BOXES HELP BIRDS!

These Birds Need YOUR Help!

Brown-headed Nuthatches are losing ground as North Carolina loses its pine forests.

Placing nest boxes in your backyard will provide these cuties with a home year round - and that's just good old southern hospitality!

A Place to Call Home

Boxes designed for bluebirds will work for Brown-headed Nuthatches—they just needs a smaller hole, only 1" or 1 1/8" in diameter.

Bluebirds and nuthatches make fine neighbors so you can put houses for each at least 30' apart.

Timing is Everything

Nuthatches begin building nests as early as December and usually lay 5-7 white-speckled-with-brown eggs once a year from March through early May. Babies leave the nest by early June.

But these little birds also roost in boxes all winter so putting up boxes any time helps our squeaky friends.
